
## **Principal's Report**


#### Dear Parents

This week was an exciting one for us. On Wednesday Yasmin London from ySafe: Social Media & Cyber Safety Experts, spent the day here, delivering cyber safety sessions to everyone from Kindergarten to Year 6. Yasmin, who was in another life, the Youth Liaison Police Officer for the Eastern Suburbs Police Command and based at Rose Bay Police Station, presented engaging sessions to our students. The feedback we received was very positive. On Wednesday evening, 38 of our parents zoomed in for a live webinar with Yasmin. Yasmin has made this available via a link which you will find in the body of the newsletter and on the School App. This will be available for the next week. Yasmin will also present to the staff on strategies for Cyber safety. We are hopeful that you will be able to utilise some of the strategies that Yasmin discussed. As part of the program, Yasmin has set up the Vaucluse Public School Cyber Safety Hub. The link for this is also published in the newsletter. The Hub assist parents with cyber safety questions and / or concerns. Parents are able to seek advice and how- to instructions from ySafe's experts. The world of cyber safety is a moveable, changeable feast and this resource will assist parents in negotiating how to find ways of keeping their child's online activity safe and responsible. #### Dear VPS Families

On Friday 27 November 2020 the P&C and School Staff have organised a fun afternoon of activity and colour to mark the end of the 2020 school year.

The children will participate in sports based activities rotating in year groups to different stations. Included are a Disco/dance, relays, obstacle course, fitness, netball and soccer.

Teachers will be squirting 'Safe for All' non toxic, non-flammable, skin safe, biodegradable and environmentally friendly coloured Holi powder on to the children at each station. The powder is made of corn starch and food grade colours.

### Morning Drop-Off

You can drop your child off at either gate starting at 8:50am. Members of staff will be supervising both gates. Please do not enter the school grounds.

### Early Pick-Up

If you need to pick up your child early, please call the office and wait outside the Cambridge Ave gate. A member of staff will bring your child to meet you at the gate.

### Away From School

If your child is unwell, they must stay home from school. If they have any flu or cold symptoms, you must provide a negative COVID-19 test before returning to school. Please email or use the SkoolBag app to notify the school of an absence.
