ay Watering

Evapotranspiration is the rate of water removal from the soil by plants and soil capillary action. Precipitation is the rate of rainfall. Sydney lawn needs 15 millimetres (mm) of precipitation a week to keep up with the rate of Evapotranspiration. That's every week. Any less, and just like us, they suffer badly.

Friday is our only watering day. Friday is the only day the General Assistant works. Friday is best because it lets the lawns dry out ready for play on Monday.

Last Friday we had the sprinklers going in the rain. After drizzling all day, only 3 millimetres of rain had fallen. The sprinklers were used for a bit over an hour to put on the other 12 millimetres. Its simple maths. More than 15 mm over the weekend (even a torrent) would be a badly needed bonus. So help us help the lawns by leaving the sprinklers on, even if your instincts say otherwise. Many thanks.
