Dear Families.

As you are aware Typhoon Haiyan has had a devastating effect on the people of the Philippines. Next Thursday the SRC, staff and students would like to assist the children of the Philippines affected by this terrible tragedy. Students are invited to come to school dressed in any of the colours of the Filipino National Flag which are royal blue, scarlet red, white and golden yellow. Students are asked to bring gold and silver coins to create a map of the Philippines on the playground at recess with Ms Aspden and Mr Styles during recess.

All proceeds will be sent to UNICEF who has sent out an appeal for \$34 million to help 4 million children impacted by the typhoon, saying funding is urgently needed for food, medicine, clean water and sanitation.

As many of you may know Ms Hallahan is on a cycling holiday. I know that she spent a lot of time prior to her departure ensuring that she had all the appropriate equipment such as a helmet. Lately, we have noticed that occasionally students are cycling or scootering to school without wearing helmets. This is of concern as a bicycle is considered a vehicle. As such, bicycle riders are required to obey the road rules, including stopping at red lights or stop signs, giving way as indicated by signage and giving hand signals when changing direction. It is compulsory to wear a correctly fitted approved helmet when riding a bike in NSW.

This applies to all bicycle riders, regardless of age, including children on bicycles with training wheels and any child being carried as a passenger on a bike or in a trailer.

Other rules that specifically apply to our school community are:

- Children must ride on the footpath if less than 12 years old
- Adults may ride on the footpath if you are supervising an under 12 year old child

 If you are a parent you must ride on the footpath if you are carrying a person under 10 years old as a passenger on your bicycle or in or on a bicycle trailer you are towing.

I would like to remind students that helmets should be worn when using scooters. All students are expected to dismount their vehicles on entry to the school grounds and walk them in to avoid colliding with other students.

On Wednesday Kindergarten had a wonderful Mad Hatter's Tea Party which marked our last Orientation for 2013. Our cohort of 2013 had a blast with our gorgeous new students. A big thanks to parents who helped lay out the feast. It was gone in the twinkling of an eye.



CLASS FORMATION POLICY FOR 2014

The staff of Vaucluse Public School recognise the need for careful consideration to be given to the formation of class groupings. Teachers make decisions regarding the placement of children in based on their experience. knowledge of individual children and their skills and understandings as professional educators. Our intention is to provide students with a learning environment that suits their individual academic needs, social learning styles temperaments in the knowledge that this is the platform for optimum growth. We acknowledge that some children can find the start of the new academic year challenging. It is our firm belief that by supporting children to adjust to new situations within the supportive and familiar environment of a school we are developing resilience and self management skills for life.

Groupings

✓ The number of children in a class will be as follows: Kindergarten Average of 20 children

Year 1

Average of 22 children

Year 2 Average of 24 children

Year 3-6 Average

of 30 children

- ✓ There will be occasions when it is necessary to form a composite/multi-age class. It is widely acknowledged through a body of international and national research, that there is no evidence to support the belief that composite/multi-age classes have a detrimental effect on children's progress.
- ✓ If at all possible, composite/multi-age classes will be formed to fit within stage groupings. It is recognised that this is not always practical.
- ✓ Composite/multi-age classes will have as even a mix of grades and gender as is practical. When a composite/multi-age class is formed in Kindergarten, Year 1 or 2, the number of children will be on average the same as the average expected in the higher year level.
- ✓ The inclusion of a child in a composite/multiage class will be based on the child's individual learning needs and the benefits that would be gained from such a placement.
- ✓ Children will be provided with the opportunity to nominate five friends they would like to be with in the following year at the end of the previous year. It is intended that all children will have at least one person they nominate with them.
- Classes will be formed in mixed ability groups. An even number of boys and girls is desirable. There may be times when staff believes it to be beneficial for gender based groups to be formed for certain teaching and learning activities.

Time Frame

✓ Classes will be formed in the final two weeks of term 4, 2013. This gives teachers time to consider the composition of the class and to consult collegially on the appropriate placement of students. At this time the placement of new enrolments if known is also considered. It is acknowledged that there may be times when

- classes need to be reconfigured in Term 1 to cater to fluctuations in enrolment. Because classes are not final we do not inform parents.
- ✓ Teachers will then have the opportunity to consult with each other to ensure the best possible mix of children.
- ✓ At the commencement of the 2014 school year all students will return to their 2013 class

Parental input

✓ It is recognised that parents/caregivers often have reasons for wanting their children in a certain group or with a certain teacher. It is only in *very exceptional* circumstances that children will be moved from one class to another. Consultation will take place between the child's previous teachers as well as the School's Learning Support Team.

If your children are continuously collected before or at the beginning of an After care session , dropped at Before care at the end of a session, or are constantly absent, it is clear that you do not require care for your children. (Teachers supervise the school playground from 8.50am, not before)

Voosc Supervisors are aware of the arrival and departure times of all children for each session and reserve the right to cancel a booking if the policies of our service are not respected.

Families will be advised of their 2014 placements within the next few weeks.
