

There was much energy and excitement in the room on Tuesday evening. A very productive discussion took place that generated some exciting and interesting ideas for the following year. From my perspective it was very heart warming to see so many parents willingly and enthusiastically putting their hands up to help. What was very clear was a strong commitment to sharing and making Vaucluse PS a better place for all students. We love the inclusiveness that has become second nature to all that we do. We are looking forward to a productive 2016 and supporting our students in a myriad of ways.

On Thursday our students participated in a wonderful incursion with Author Susan Gervay. Susan spoke about inclusion and anti-bullying strategies. The feedback from our students was extremely positive.

At the moment we have an unusually large number of students either arriving to school late or departing early from school. We are seeking parent support to try and reduce the disruptions that this causes to classrooms. If late arrivals or early departures are a regular occurrence because of commitments outside of the school an application for partial absence must be filled out and handed to the office. The principal must approve this application and then it must be approved by the School Director, Dr Sylvia Corish. If Leave is not granted for these regular absences then the student is marked absent on the roll. Patterns of absences are then followed up by the Home School Liaison Officer. Please think carefully of the disruption caused to your child's class before you make the decision to arrive late or leave early. Each class teacher would appreciate this consideration and our students would have more productive learning time.

You will never guess the name was of the man who rode the Horse to Hillend? Metta Tackson. What a silly name! Thier is many languages and its crowded with people, also thier is lots of Opium in the air and I try to stay away from it. I was at the pub one and I was hit on the head with a beer bottlebut in alright.

I do alluvial mining with a cladie and a pan. It's freezing at night and all I have is a small sheet and my clothes, I am not sure If I have caught numbers. I have not been that successful with gold but I am sure I will find more gold in the future. I hope I will be rich and share the money with you, soon! will be return to home
