Dear Parents

Musica Viva was a brilliant way to commence the short week. The musical group, was a mini gamelan orchestra from Indonesia. Throughout the day we were transported to Bali by the sounds coming from the hall upstairs. Our teachers and students thoroughly enjoyed this musical experience. We are always delighted to have the Musica Viva concerts at our school. They are musicians of superb quality and the presentations are diverse and interesting. Our staff and students always learn so much from them. We are very fortunate to be able to present these opportunities at school and not have to travel.

Many parents have commented positively on the new structure being built for the lift. We think when it is completed it will be an asset to our school. Miss Butt is looking forward to its completion. She sees many possibilities to the new space and an expansion of the harbour view from her room. Apart from the physical appearance we will be thrilled when all our students can access upstairs, the computer room, counsellor's office and hall.

Sadly I have had more complaints this week of parents parking across our neighbours' driveways of a morning and afternoon. Several of our neighbours have children at other schools and have been prevented from getting out of their homes to go and pick up their children. We would be most appreciative if this selfish behaviour was not part of our school culture. This morning we had a parent stop in the middle of the pedestrian crossing to drop their children off. They exited the car to unpack the boot regardless of safety to their own children and all the other children attempting to cross. Those children who were attempting to use the pedestrian crossing had to walk around the car and put themselves at risk. A member of staff asked them to move and the response is unable to be printed here. I think the incident speaks for itself. Please consider your actions and how they impact on our children. Sadly when parents are asked to move on or to cease their dangerous behaviour the response is always one of aggression. We need to change this and think carefully about keeping all our children safe.
