WEEK 9


LEADERS ANNOUNCED: at a Whole School Assembly, CAPTAINS ANNOUNCED at Presentation Day.






















SRC FUNDRAISER

CORN BREAD MUFFINS



INGREDIENTS YIELDS 12

WET INGREDIENTS

- 2/2p butter, melted unsalted
- •2eggs
- ●¾cup milk
- 1cup canned creamed corn

DRY INGREDIENTS

- ¾p polenta
- ●1cups plain flour
- 1tbsp baking powder
- ●cup white sugar
- ●tsp salt

EQUIPMENT

- Muffin tin
- Measuring cups &
- spoons Mixing bowls
- Whisks
- Wooden spoon
- Metal spoons
- Cooling rack

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Preheat oven to 180°C.
- 2. Oil spray, lightly a 12 hole standard muffin tin.
- 3. MEASURE dry ingredients into a mixing bowl and WHISK to COMBINE.
- 4. MEASURE wet ingredients into a separate mixing bowl and WHISK to COMBINE.
- 5. POUR wet ingredients into dry ingredients and MIX with a wooden spoon until combined.
- 6. Using a desert spoon, SPOON the batter into the greased muffin tray use it all up, fill the holes right up!
- 7. Bake in the oven for 20 minutes or until the top is golden brown.
- 8. Remove muffin tray from the oven.

Optional: Brush tops with melted butter. Cool for 5 mins then remove muffins onto a rack.
