Why Music?

CONCERT BAND (OPEN TO YEARS 3-6)

The school music program aims to give students the opportunity to experience music learning in a nurturing group environment. All students regardless of their ability will learn to:

- Play a musical instrument
 Develop an annual control of the control of th
- Develop an appreciation of music
 Improve their aural and rhythmic skills
 Express themselves through music

Commitment to band also means there are certain expectations throughout the year, both from students and conductor. These include:

- Training Band Rehearsals (Beginner)
 Senior Band Rehearsals (Intermediate and Advanced)
 Weekly lessons

- Assembly performances Workshops



STRING ENSEMBLES (OPEN TO YEARS K-6)

The string ensembles are broken up into two categories, String Orchestra and Guitar Ensemble. Students who play Violin, Viola or Cello will be able to be a part of the String Orchestra whilst our Guitar Ensemble will be open to our advanced guitarists.

Commitment to these ensembles include:

- Beginner String Orchestra rehearsals
 Senior String Orchestra rehearsals
 Guitar Ensemble

- Weekly lessons Assembly performances
- Workshops

CHOOSING AN INSTRUMENT

When joining the band, we ask students to nominate 3 instruments, in order, that they are interested in learning. Instrument allocation is determined by the conductor based on what is required to have a balanced band. We always try out best to allocate each child their preferred instrument, but on some occasions children may be allocated their second or third choice - we will be in contact before confirming the decision to make sure everyone is happy.

OUR EXPECTATIONS

Being part of the band is a calendar year commitment. We expect all students to be dedicated and to attend scheduled rehearsals and lessons. Learning an instrument takes time and patience. Some will find it easier

We can offer band, group lessons and private tuition.

There will be an annual admin fee of \$44, which will include a band book, folder and other music.
